This year, she is a participant in Chorale as the vice president (the auditioned choir), Swing 16 (the select jazz choir), AP Music Theory, and is a TA in Concert Choir (the non auditioned choir). However, in past years, she has also participated in voice class, multiple theory classes, and band. Lindsay is a key participant in the school musicals, as president, and dance captain for four years. Her favorite credits include Cosset (Les Mis), Mable (Pirates of Penzance), and singing the role of Christine (Phantom of the Opera). Outside of school she has been accepted into many all counties, area all states, and was selected into the 2019 Conference All State Choir, and 2020 All Nationals Choir. Lindsay music directs at Syracuse Children's Theater, helps put on shows with Front Row Players (non profit organization allowing adults with special needs to put on musicals), sings and plays bells in church choirs, teaches private piano lessons, and enjoys her many classes at The Ballet and Dance Center. She plans to continue her love for music at the Crane School of Music studying music education, and is excited to grow the musical passion of others.

Dominic Fiacco, 16-year old resident of the small Adirondack foothills village of Poland, NY, began studying music at age 4. That fall, he began lessons with Stephen Best, organist at First Church. He has performed multiple times on the Society for New Music's Rising Stars programs. He has also performed solo recitals for the Jackson Lunch Hour Series at Utica College, the Unitarian Church of Barneveld, and the Remsen Performing Camp; Visual Arts Center.



Hannah Sywulski is a senior at Paul V. Moore High School. She has worked with her voice teacher, Laura Enslin, for her entire high school career, and has taken piano and French horn with Joyce Lindsley for the past 8 years. Miloradovic. Outside of school Rosee is the Vice President of the Jr. B sharp club and plays around the community at church, nursing homes and weddings. In school, Rosee participates in her school's musicals singing and dancing and is also the President of Tri-M the musical honor society. Rosee participates in All county, Area all state, All State, and All Eastern. Rosee will be heading to Chicago to study Music Education at Depaul University.



Eburn Oguntola is a 15-year-old composer, conductor, violinist and pianist. She was recently featured on From the Top as a composer, where she was interviewed by Kevin Olusola from Pentatonix on NPR radio, along with her composition professionally recorded by performers Peter Dugan, Charles Yang, and Doorri Na, that was included in the show. In 2019-2020, she was chosen as one of the five Luna Composition Lab fellows, a mentorship program for young female composers, in which her piece was recorded and premiered by the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra. Through this program, she became the recipient of the Patrino Foundation Fellowship. Her music was also performed in

the Bergen International Festival in Norway by Bit20 Ensemble alongside works by Missy Mazzoli and John Adams, this June. In summer of 2020, Eburn attended the internationally acclaimed Eastman Classical Studies Program with a merit-based scholarship, and through 2020-2021, worked on a project with Syracuse University and the Symphoria orchestra to play and perform her orchestral piece. During quarantine, Eburn collaborated with a few musicians featuring Johnny Gandelsman, a Grammy-award winning violinist, to create a virtual concert musically narrating the unfortunate events of 2020. The video has garnered more than 1,300 views. Eburn was also commissioned by Chamber Music Pittsburgh to write a solo violin piece for Johnny Gandelsman to be world premiered in January. Additionally, Eburn is a violinist in the Symphoria Young Artist Orchestra. She attended Junior High Area All State and Junior High All County, (the second year as concertmaster) two years in a row. She has also started conducting lessons at Eastman and has conducted her high school orchestra, playing her original composition this year. Her work has been endorsed by I CARE IF YOU LISTEN, Music by Black Composers (MBC), and WSyr-TV.
